

Someone recently said to me, "Man, you are going to have a long year, traveling and doing Lions stuff"! I thought for a moment and realized that I have barely gotten my feet wet and have almost two months under my belt already. Yep - this year is going to fly by...

This month I would like to let you know the goals that I have for my year as District Governor.

- Each club to increase membership by at least one over their current membership.  
(This is an easy goal, but you need to get out there and just ask. If you are in need of ideas, we have an energetic team of "B & B" (Lions Randy Beaver & Bruce Beck) to help you get started.)
- I also want to work on retention of the members we already have. We need to find out why those members are leaving and what it is that we can do to prevent that from happening.
- Every club have your PU 101's & club elections in on time  
(It happened last year and I KNOW you can do it again this year)
- Increase attendance at the midwinter by 30%  
(The registrations are on line now & I will talk about that next month)
- 100% club officer participation at the College of Leadership  
(I can't stress enough how important this training is for officers)
- Each club to have their Club President & Secretary at the Zone meetings  
(Of course we want participation from all the club members)
- Educate all clubs of the 11 Lions projects & support them financially  
(Any donation is acceptable, no matter how big or how small)
- Increase the Peace Poster contest participation by 20%  
(This is under the direction of Youth Outreach Chairs Jeanne Roggenkamp and Evie Ladd.  
This year's theme is "Our World , Our Future")
- Each Project Chair should be invited to a minimum of 3 club visits per year  
(I hope that every President has been to the Zone Fairs and have signed up their three Chairs. What a great way to learn more about the projects and what is new)

You now have your homework to help me reach my goals and strengthen our District and our passion for Lions.

The Reading Action Program which was started last year is going to be a 10 year commitment to help increase reading and literacy rates. September 8th is dubbed International Literacy Day, With school back in session, think about going into the schools to read to the students or perhaps make a donation to the schools for them to buy books. Lion Pat read last year to the students and I know that she is ready to get back and do it again. The greatest gift is a passion for reading.



- ⇒ An information sheet can be folded or maybe just a half or third sheet printed both sides.
- ⇒ Print on a heavier or nicer grade paper.
- ⇒ Color brochures get noticed more than black and white.
- ⇒ List your service activities and your fundraising events
- ⇒ Include your local activities first
- ⇒ Use pictures of your club members in action – doing the things that show how Lions benefit your communities
- ⇒ Use the Lions logo
- ⇒ Have your brochure available at all events, at your meeting place and local businesses (if possible)
- ⇒ Include contact information




