

Service Animals

Among the scores of other new laws taking effect in August is one that makes it criminal for pet owners to pose their canines as trained service dogs.

The [legislation](#), signed in April by Gov. Mark Dayton, imposes stricter sanctions on those seeking permission to bring their dog to public places. First-time violators will be charged with a petty misdemeanor and face misdemeanor charges for subsequent offenses.

Rep. Steve Green, R-Fosston, said he sponsored the bill after an elderly constituent's service dog had to be put down because it was attacked by another dog whose owner had passed it off at a public establishment as a service animal.

Under the [Minnesota Human Rights Act](#), it is "an unfair discriminatory practice" for a public facility to prohibit someone with a physical or sensory disability from bringing a service animal.

But the new law makes clear that canine companions for emotional support don't qualify for special rights or privileges, and that only dogs can be considered service animals.

"You can't necessarily bring your parrot or peacock on the airplane because you think you need it," Green said. "We still have to protect the public, and that should be our main goal."

This scholarship is available to a college student who is in their final two years of obtaining a degree in a field that leads to a career in working with youth.

You can print the cover letter that instructs the students on how they can access the fillable application form or print the entire scholarship to distribute to potential applicants. Keep a few copies available for your club members to reach out to any eligible college students in your community.

Printed copies of the 5M9 Youth Outreach Scholarship will also be available at the first zone meeting later this summer; but please don't wait till then! Let's get the information out into our communities early by promoting the scholarship in your local newspapers. A prepared newspaper article was sent to each club to use for the purpose of promoting the scholarship in our community.



Lions All,

Here are a couple of important items for you:

First, Please share this information with your fellow Lions, Lioness, family members and the general public. We hope to get the word out regarding the situation with LifeSource and the impact they are making on our Lions eye bank at the U of M.

Second, the Lions Gift of Sight received notice yesterday from Allina on its decision regarding the continuation of business with the Lions Gift of Sight. In spite of Dean Tolar's requests and his subsequent meeting with the Allina CEO, they have decided to move the eye tissue business for all of their 14 hospitals to LifeSource. Many of the hospitals have shifted over to LifeSource effective immediately due to the contracts with LGS ending on July 31st. Our attempts to renegotiate new contracts for these hospitals proved ineffective.

According to sources, this decision was facilitated by Sara Criger (Mercy Hospital President & LifeSource President) and Dr. Dan Conrad (recent addition to the staff at Minnesota Eye Consultants - Dr. Lindstrom's practice). Estimates for the loss of tissue for transplant & research from all the hospitals and medical examiners to LifeSource is 33%. Please keep in mind that LifeSource is concentrating on corneas and not research tissues, which makes this situation even more devastating. This news about Allina is disappointing and frustrating to say the least. Please make sure to inform your local Lions and Lioness who have an Allina hospital in their community of their decision. This may give some clubs and individuals an opportunity to readdress their financial and volunteer support of a hospital that has, in a sense, turned its back to the Lions.

As additional information about these two points or any other items or announcements come up, I will make sure to pass it along to you. Your comments and questions are welcomed and encouraged. Please try to keep a positive outlook and don't let this recent bad news affect your support of the LGS and the foundation.
